The amended label referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable. This approval does not affect any conditions that were previously imposed on this registration. You continue to be subject to existing conditions on your registration and any deadlines connected with them.

The Agency, in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, has completed reviewing all of the information submitted with your application to support the Registration Review of the above referenced product in connection with the Thiophanate-methyl and Carbendazim Interim Decision, and has concluded that your submission is acceptable.

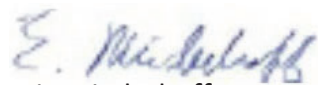
A stamped copy of your labeling is enclosed for your records. This labeling supersedes all previously accepted labeling and must be used at your next label printing. Pursuant to 40 CFR 156.10(a)(6) you must submit one copy of the final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the new labeling. In accordance with 40 CFR 152.130(c), you may distribute or sell this product under the previously approved labeling for 12 months from the date of this letter. After 12 months, you may only distribute or sell this product if it bears this new revised labeling or subsequently approved labeling.

"To distribute or sell" is defined under FIFRA section 2(gg) and its implementing regulation at 40 CFR 152.3.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to the company's website on your label, then please be aware that the website becomes labeling under FIFRA and is subject to review by the Agency. See FIFRA section 2(p)(2). If the website is false or misleading, the product would be misbranded and unlawful to sell or distribute under FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(E). 40 CFR 156.10(a)(5) list examples of statements EPA may consider false or misleading. In addition, regardless of whether a website is referenced on your product's label, claims made on the website may not substantially differ from those claims approved through the registration process, FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(B). Therefore, should the Agency find or if it is brought to our attention that a website contains false or misleading statements or claims substantially differing from the EPA approved registration, the website will be referred to the EPA's Office of Enforcement and Compliance.

Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions. If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6. ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: This chemical is toxic to terrestrial and aquatic plants, fish, and aquatic invertebrates. DIRECTIONS FOR USE: It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons. The application of carbendazim as a material preservative must be accomplished with engineering controls that achieve closed loading. The following dosage rates are provided in parts per million (ppm) of Preventol® M 78-D per weight of the finished product. Field testing is recommended to achieve optimum effectiveness.

Paints and stains: 5,000 – 16,666 ppm

Wood protective stains: 3,000 – 15,000 ppm

Adhesives, caulks, grouts, and sealants: 3,000 – 13,333 ppm

Joint cements: 5,000 – 13,333 ppm

Masonry [**Not for Use in the State of California**]: 5,000 – 13,333 ppm

Roof coatings [**Not for Use in the State of California**]: 7,000 – 16,666 ppm

Stucco and EIFS coatings [**Not for Use in the State of California**]: 5,000 – 13,333 ppm

Inks [**Not for Use in the State of California**]: 3,000 – 13,333 ppm

Wallboard (Drywall and Gypsum Board) [**Not for Use in the State of California**]: 100 – 13,333 ppm

This product must only be used in dry-end preservation in pulp and paper processes. Applications through the wet-end of the pulp and paper process are prohibited. Paper Coatings via application into a size-press, water box, wet-stack (wet web) or drystack application at a dose rate of 500 – 20,000 ppm based on the total weight of the treating solution. Paper products dosed via application into the dry end of paper process into a size-press, water box, wet-stack (wet web) or dry stack application at a dose rate of 500-20,000 ppm based on the final manufactured paper weight. Preventol® M 78-D is not to be used in formulations intended for food contact paper coatings or food contact adhesive uses.

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STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Storage between 32°F (0°C) and 90°F (32°C) is recommended. **PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage and disposal. Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticides, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label directions, contact your State pesticide or environmental control agency or the hazardous waste representative at the nearest EPA regional office for guidance. Open dumping is prohibited.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. Clean container promptly after emptying. Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill the container 1/4 full with water. Replace and tighten closures. Tip container on its side and roll it back and forth, ensuring at least one complete revolution, for 30 seconds. Stand the container on its end and tip it back and forth several times. Turn the container over onto its other end and tip it back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times. Then offer for recycling or reconditioning if available, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or incineration, or, if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.
