FOR CONTROL OF FLIES, MOSQUITOES, AND GNATS in homes, hospitals, food establishments, farm buildings and warehouses. Close all windows and stop all ventilators. Pilot lights should be extinguished. In hospitals, patients should be removed from room prior to treatment. Rooms should be ventilated for 2 hours after spraying. Do not return patients to room until after ventilation. Remove pets, birds and cover fish aquariums before spraying. Allow only fine mist or "dry" fog to contact fabric or surfaces that might be affected by the oil base. Direct fine mist or fog upward toward the center of the room and around the sides until the area is filled with fog or mist particles. Keep area closed for 10 to 15 minutes. Do not remain in treated areas. Ventilate the area thoroughly before re-entry. Clean up and destroy fallen insects. Resmethrin Insect Spray is acceptable by the USDA as a pesticide for use in all areas of official establishments operating under the Federal meat, poultry, shell egg grading and

CONTACT AND SPACE SPRAY - TO KILL COCKROACHES, CONFUSED FLOUR & SAWTOOTHED GRAIN BEETLES, CENTIPEDES, EARWIGS, GRAIN MITES, SOLENTS, AND SPIDERS IN SHELTERED SITUATIONS. Adjust spraying device to deliver a coarse wet spray. Apply as a contact spray to hit as many insects as possible underneath refrigerators and around pallets, and in most areas around sinks and pipes. Apply to storage areas, baseboards, and the inside surfaces of boxcars and trucks at a rate of 1 gallon to 1,000 sq ft. Apply into cracks and crevices, in points between equipment and floors, equipment legs and bases, conduits, motor housings, and junction or switch boxes. Prior to application, de-energize electrical equipment. After application, allow time for oil to evaporate before starting motors or placing switches in "on" position. Contact as many insects as possible. Apply as a space spray at the rate of 1 fl oz per 1,000 cu. ft. of room space. Repeat dosage as necessary for control. Leave the room closed for 1 hour. Do not remain in treated area. Ventilate the area thoroughly before re-entry. Do not apply directly to food. In commercial food handling facilities, cover or remove any food and food processing equipment during application. Do not apply while food processing is under way. After space spraying in meat packing plants, bakeries, and other food processing plants, wash with effective cleaning compound and rinse with potable water all equipment, benches, shelving, etc., where exposed food will be handled. In the home, all food processing surfaces and utensils should be covered during treatment or thoroughly washed before use. Remove pets and birds, and cover fish aquariums before spraying.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

Container Disposal: Triple rinse or equivalent then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other State and local procedure.
