DIRECTIONS FOR USE

IT IS A VIOLATION OF FEDERAL LAW TO USE THIS PRODUCT IN A MANNER INCONSISTENT WITH ITS LABELING

1. For housekeeping sanitation--Dissolve contents of one pouch (8 oz.) in a scrub bucket and add four gallons of water, proportionately less for smaller amounts of water. Preferably, use without soap as a rinse for best sanitation.
2. For bacteriostatic odor control in field latrine buckets - Dissolve contents of one pouch (8 oz.) in two quarts of water. After contents are thoroughly dissolved, pour one quart of resulting solution into each latrine bucket (14-quart capacity). Empty each bucket when it becomes half full.
3. Make fresh solutions for each use.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

- Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.
- Storage: Keep package tightly closed when not in use.
- Pesticide disposal: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

IF INHALED	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Move person to fresh air. - If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth if possible. - Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice.
