DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

To Operate: Shake Before Using. Hold pump sprayer 18 to 24 inches from foliage or surfaces being treated. Direct the spray to provide thorough coverage of upper and lower leaf surfaces. Use caution on new growth and tender foliage. Use indoors, outdoors or in greenhouses throughout the growing season, or as a pre-harvest treatment when other insecticides are prohibited due to residue restrictions and use limitations. Repeat treatment every seven days, or more frequently under heavy insect pressure, to control infestations. May be applied on the day of harvest.

Use on the following ornamentals: African Violets, Asters, Azaleas, Begonias, Camellias, Carnations, Chrysanthemums, Dahlias, Dogwood, Geraniums, Gladioli, Marigolds, Roses and Wandering Jew. **To Control:** Aphids, Flea Beetles, Leafhoppers and Whiteflies. **To Kill on Contact:** Gypsy Moth Caterpillars and adults, adult Japanese Beetles and Eastern and Forest Tent Caterpillars.

On Roses and in Flower Gardens: Treat plans and flowers as soon as insects appear, making sure spray penetrates dense foliage.

On Trees and Shrubs: Treat trees and shrubs as soon as insects emerge (usually late spring). Evenly treat leaves, branches and tree trunks penetrating dense foliage.

Use on the following crops: Asparagus, Beans, Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Celery, Collards, Cranberries, Eggplant, Kale, Lettuce, Mustard Greens, Peppers, Potatoes, Radishes, Spinach, Tomatoes and Turnips. **To Control:** Aphids, Asparagus Beetles, Blister Beetles, Cabbage Loopers, Colorado Potato Beetles, Cross-Striped Cabbageworms, Diamondback Moth

Larvae, Fireworms, Flea Beetles, Green Peach Aphids, Harlequin Bugs, Imported Cabbageworms, Leafhoppers, Leaf-tiers, Mexican Bean Beetles, Stink Bugs, 12-Spotted Cucumber Beetles, Webworms and Whiteflies.

Storage And Disposal

Storage: Store in a cool, dry (preferably locked) storage area inaccessible to children and pets. Protect from freezing. **If Empty:** Do not reuse empty container.
