Dear Ms. Pritchett:

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable subject to the conditions of registration and label comments below. Two (2) copies of the finished labeling must be submitted prior to releasing the product for shipment. A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

1. Per the March 17, 2010 meeting with registrants of spot-on pet products, this registration is now time-limited and expires two years from the date this product is first released for shipment.

You must provide the Agency with a projected release for shipment date within 30 days of the date of this Notice of Registration. The Agency will calculate the expiration date based on the projected release for shipment date until an actual release for shipment date is provided in writing.

- 2. Please consider limiting the formulations of this product to one basic confidential statement of formula. The Agency may require this in the future and no additional alternate formulations or minor formulation amendments will be approved for this product in the future.
- 3. You must submit quarterly enhanced incident reports and quarterly sales information in doses sold for this product beginning January 1, April 1, July 1, or October 1, whichever date most closely follows the date this product is first released for shipment.

Please flag any Confidential Business Information as such. Enhanced incident reporting should be submitted to the Product Manager. Quarterly sales information should be submitted to the Registration Division, Immediate Office (attn: Kimberly Nesci).

- 4. Along with the enhanced incident reporting, you must submit an analysis of the incidents seen, to include the following details:
 - All incidents should be reported including all minor dermal and ocular irritation reports.
 - Summary table for dogs showing number of incidents of each severity code for each route of exposure. Each incident should only be reported once. If one incident has several routes of exposure, the order should be ocular > oral > dermal. In other words, an incident with both oral and dermal exposure would be reported as oral exposure, and an incident with both ocular and oral exposure would be reported as ocular exposure.
 - A similar summary table for cats (misuse or secondary exposure) showing number of incidents of each severity code for each route of exposure.

- Summary table for dogs and table for cats showing number of incidents that are believed due to secondary exposure (e.g., multi-pet households).
- A summary table for dogs showing number of incidents for each severity code for these age ranges: <3 months, 3-6 months, 6-9 months, 9-12 months, 1 yr, 2 yr, 3 yr, 4 yr, 5 yr, 6 yr, 7 yr, 8 yr, 9 yr, 10 yr, 11 yr, 12 yr, 13 yr, 14 yr, 15 yr, >15 yr.
- A summary table showing the number of dog incidents for each severity code for each pet weight range on the product label.
- A summary table for dog weight showing number of incidents for each product weight range. This table should show number of incidents in dogs weighing less than that product weight range, number of incidents in dogs in lower half of weight range, number of incidents in dogs in upper half of weight range, and dogs weighing more than the product weight range.
- Table showing number of incidents for each dog breed.
- Table showing number of incidents in dogs for each clinical sign.
- Table showing number of incidents in dogs for each organ system.
- Report aggregate incidents, but do not combine moderate and minor incidents.
- 5. For consistency throughout the label, correct the weight ranges in the Use Directions and Application tables to reflect the following:
 - For dogs weighing 29 pounds or less,
 - For dogs weighing 30 pounds to 59 pounds,
 - For dogs weighing 60 pounds or greater.
- 6. In the third bullet on page 1, add the word "supply" after "3 months."
- 7. In the fourth bullet on page 1 and in the "Note: DO NOT APPLY..." statement on page 3, delete "Intended."
- 8. On page 1, since the front page has package labeling for use on dogs 29 pounds or less, replace the alternate word bracket in the ninth bullet containing "[Number] Convenient, Pre-filled Applicators" with "[Three, 3]."
- 9. On page 2, add "supply" after "[3 months]" in the sentence under the Directions for Use.
- 10. On page 2 under Physical or Chemical Hazards, the word "Combustible" must be listed as required text, rather than optional text.

- 11. On page 2 under Precautionary Statements, add a ":" and two spaces after "Animals." In the Hazards to Humans & Domestic Animals.
- 12. On page 2 in the Hazards to Humans & Domestic Animals, bold the word "ANY" in the sentence "Sensitivities may occur..."
- 13. On page 2 in the First Aid box, remove the brackets and "(if space available)" statement from the last bullet, since this is required language and must appear on the label.
- 14. For clarity and consistency throughout the label, always include the statement "six months and older" wherever "Puppies" are referenced.
- 15. To ensure that this product is only used on dogs, change the word "Pet's" to "Dog's" in the Treatment Schedule table on page 2 of the label.
- 16. In order for the Treatment Schedule table on page 2 to be consistent with the alternate use directions, either:
 - delete "Dosage: 1 tube every 30 days per dog" and leave the table as is, or
 - delete "Dosage: 1 tube every 30 days per dog" and insert a new column for the consumer to write the dosage (e.g., how many applicators are needed) for the respective dog(s).
- 17. Move the appropriate Monthly Application chart from page 6 to page 2, closer to the Treatment Schedule table so that the consumer may clearly see and note what the appropriate application for the dog is.
- 18. For clarity, replace the words "first month's" with "an" in the first statement of the Alternate Packaging Directions on pages 3 through 6.
- 19. In the Storage and Disposal box on page 3, remove the alternate language in brackets and update the Pesticide Disposal and Container Handling statement (per 40 CFR part 156.140) to read as follows:
 - "Pesticide Disposal and Container Handling: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. If empty: Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. If partly filled: Call your local solid waste agency or 1-800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions. Never place unused product down any indoor or outdoor drain."
- 20. On page 4 in the Alternate Language for dogs "Over 30 lbs," change all references to read "Weighing 30 pounds to 59 pounds."
- 21. On page 5 for Alternate Language for Dogs up to 60 lbs, change the reference to read "Weighing 30 pounds to 59 pounds."

- 22. On page 5 for Alternate Language for Dogs up to 60 lbs, move "Net Contents: 4 1 cc applicators [dogs/puppies less than 30 pounds]" from this section and create a new section for "Alternate Language for "Dogs 29 pounds or less" to reflect this packaging's net contents.
- 23. At the bottom of page 5 for the second set of Alternate Language for Dogs of All Sizes for the packaging containing three applicators, the line starting with "1.5 month treatment for dogs..." must be deleted because this can be misinterpreted/misleading to the user.

If EPA determines that future mitigation measures are necessary for all pet spot-on products, the Agency will inform registrants, and if needed, EPA may take regulatory action. If you have any questions regarding this action, please contact Rosanna Louie at (703) 308-0037.
