B-220 is a highly effective algicide and bactericide for use in controlling algae and bacterial slimes found in recirculating cooling towers, air washers and evaporative condensers.

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In those cases where accumulations of organic matter and or dirt are excessive, a cleaning and flushing of the system should be carried out prior to initiating the micro-biocide treatment.

Apply microbiocide at a point where uniform distribution is assured such as the tower sump.


