PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS

AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

DANGER: A flammable, corrosive, irritant—protect eyes when handling. May burn skin, irritate eyes, and may cause chemical burns when in contact with mucous membranes. Avoid breathing dust or fumes. DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

FOR SWIMMING POOLS

1. Proper conditioning of pool water is necessary to insure maximum effectiveness of the Chlorinated Tablets 1". Previously unconditioned pools should be treated with Stabilizer. Follow instructions on the label.
2. Adjust pool water pH to 7.2-7.6. Use pH Minus to lower pH and pH Plus to increase pH. Follow instructions on the label of the product used.
3. SUPERCHLORINATION is occasionally necessary to maintain a clean and algae free pool (see directions on label of Dy-Chlor II).
4. MAINTENANCE DOSE for every 1,000 gallons of water, put into AUTOMATIC CHLORINATOR two Chlorinated Tablets 1" every 7-10 days. Check pool water frequently with a test kit and maintain 1.0-1.5 PPM chlorine residual and pH of 7.2-7.6.
5. During extremely hot weather and/or heavy bathing loads, additional dosage may be required. This can be achieved by adding 20 more tablets to the feeder for each 10,000 gallons of pool water. This provides 2.5 PPM additional chlorine dosage during the next 7 days. However, if immediate chlorine dosage is required, see directions on labels of Dy-Chlor II for quick adjustment of the residual chlorine to 1.1 PPM. After adjustment to 1.1 PPM residual chlorine by the addition of Dy-Chlor II, the Chlorinated Tablets 1" when used as directed will maintain the residual chlorine level between 1.0 and 1.5 PPM under normal use conditions.

STORAGE AND

STORAGE INSTRUCTION: Store in a cool, dry storage area. Keep from freezing. Do not feed by storage and disposal.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Securely wrap in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Do not reuse. Rinse thoroughly before discarding in trash.

GENERAL: Consult Federal, state or local health department for alternative procedures such as limited incineration.
