DIRECTIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL CHLORINATION:
For a new pool or for spring start-up, superchlorinate with this sodium hypochlorite solution for each gallon of water to 5 ppm available chlorine by weight. For Pool Maintenance:

A. Adjust pool water pH to 7.6-7.8 range.
B. Add manually or by a feeder device to maintain an available chlorine residual of this sodium hypochlorite solution of 1.0 ppm available chlorine by weight. 1.0 ppm available chlorine will depend on pool size and bather load. Use test kit to make certain the pH and chlorine levels are correct.

DIRECTIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL CHLORINATION AND SANITIZING.

Dilute this sodium hypochlorite solution 1:9 with 9 parts softened water. Mix thoroughly and apply to the surface to be sanitized. Maintain a free available chlorine residual of 1.0 ppm throughout the distribution system. As required, sampling must be done to maintain the free available chlorine residual at 1.0 ppm.

DIRECTIONS FOR SANITIZING FOOD SERVICE EQUIPMENT:
Clean equipment in the normal manner. Then, immerse in this sodium hypochlorite solution for 10 minutes. After treatment, with sodium hypochlorite solution, one fluid oz. (2 tbsps.) of this sodium hypochlorite solution will provide approximately 200 ppm available chlorine.

NOTE: This product degrades with age. It is necessary to obtain the required level of available chlorine. **STORAGE AND DISPOSAL:** Store in original container, tightly closed, in a cool, dry place. Do not store in direct sunlight. In case of spill, do not empty container thoroughly with water. Do not place in trash collection or burning. Do not use if container is damaged. Do not use if cannot be used, should be diluted with water and not contaminate food or feed by storage.
