For Outdoor Use Only. Do not spray in enclosed areas. Avoid breathing a spray product, and do not use it near food. Never use repellents over cuts, wounds, or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth, and apply sparingly around ears. When using sprays, do not spray directly into face; spray on hands first and then apply to face. 

When the guidelines are finalized, the Agency expects to issue a Data Call-In to address the revised guidelines to all registrants with registrations for personal repellent products that have not previously submitted efficacy data sufficiently consistent with the revised guidelines.
