#### HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

Aphid-Pruf is a patented aphid and whitefly repellant. Aphid-Pruf is for use on Cotton, Sorghum, Wheat (before heading), Alfalfa, Soybeans, Peas, Sunflowers (for seed only), Watermelon, Cantaloupe, Pecan trees, Honey Locust trees, Oak trees, Ornamental shrubs and Rose bushes.

It acts by rapidly increasing the rate at which sugars are transported out of the leaves. Aphids and whiteflies react by leaving the plant. Beneficial insects are not harmed; thus allowing them to guard against re-infestation in a more efficient manner.

## AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. This standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this 'label about personal protective equipment (PPE), notification to workers, and restricted-entry interval. The requirements in this box apply to uses of this product that are covered by the Worker Protection Standard.

Do not enter or allow worker entry into treated areas during the restricted entry interval (REI) of 4 hours unless wearing appropriate PPE.

PPE required for early entry to treated areas (that is permitted under the Worker Protection Standard and that involves contact with anything that has been treated, such as plants, soil, or water), is:

- long-sleeved shirt and long pants
- chemical-resistant gloves
- shoes and socks

Notify workers of the application by warning them orally and by posting warning signs at entrances to treated areas.

#### APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Mix 1 gallon Aphid\_Phruf with 4 gallons water per acre as a foliar spray. For best results, apply no more than once daily on a warm sunny day between noon and 3:00 PM and when wind speeds are low. Always include a non-ionic surfactant at the rate of 1-2 quarts/100 gallon of spray mixture. Use when aphid numbers are averaging 50 per leaf or less, and before build-up of honey dew.

Do not mix with phosphorous or sulfur or products containing phosphorous or sulfur. Use stainless steel or plastic tank, tubing and nozzles. Con or fan nozzles are best. In order to avoid excessive accumulation of chlorides in soil, do not exceed recommended application rate of 1 gallon Ahid-Pruf with 4 gallons water per acre as a foliar spray.

### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

Pesticide Storage: Store in a tightly closed container in a locked area away from children.

Pesticide Disposal: Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

Container Disposal: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration, or, if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.
