

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in labeling.

COOLING TOWERS: CITE 8030
cooling tower wood against soft or surface rot and interior staining or painting a dispersion containing 0.5 to 0.7% in water onto the clean wood surfaces. The amount of CITE 8030 per 1000
