**CONCENTRATE APPLICATION:** Ground Application: Apply specified rate in not less than 5 gallons of water per acre. Orchard Application: Apply specified rate in 20-100 gallons of water per acre. NOTE: Special concentrate equipment may be necessary for these uses.

**AIR APPLICATION:** Apply specified rate in 5-20 gallons of water per acre. Orchard rates should not be applied in less than 10 gallons of water per acre.

## DIRECTIONS FOR USE

**ALMONDS:** Shot hole - Apply 20-30 lbs per acre. Begin when buds start to swell in spring. Do not apply at or after full bloom.

**APRICOTS:** Brown rot, Shot hole - Apply 20-30 lbs per acre. Do not apply at or after full bloom.

**CHERRIES, PLUMS:** Brown rot - Apply 20-30 lbs per acre while at bud stage. Do not apply at or after full bloom.

**PEACHES, NECTARINES: Brown rot, Peach blight, Leaf curl** - Apply 20-30 lbs per acre. Apply at dormant or delayed dormant stage. Do not apply at or after full bloom.

**PEARS:** Fire blight - Apply 4 lbs per acre. Apply every 5-7 days starting at 10% bloom. The use varies according to varieties and your Field Representative or State Extension Service should be consulted for recommendations.
