NOTE TO PHYSICIANS: Contains anticholinesterase carbamate insecticide. In cases of overexposure, atropine sulfate (up to 100 grain adult dose) should be given and repeated until fully symptomatic.

Only for formulation into an insecticide for (1) the following uses: for the control of certain insects on leaf, ornamentals, non-bearing nut, citrus and other fruit trees, perimeter treatments around buildings, pest control in and around labeled buildings, and structures, including food handling establishments, and Federally Inspected Meat and Poultry plants, modes of transport, interior plantations, spider webs, cockroaches in homes, the area, floor in rodent burrows, and (2) uses for which U.S. EPA has accepted the required data and/or issuance of data that the formulator has submitted in support of registration; and (3) Use for Experimental Purposes that are in compliance with U.S. EPA requirements.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Store in a cool, dry place.
