The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided you make the following change indicated below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

- 1. Under Storage and Disposal remove "Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal" from Pesticide Disposal and place it directly below the heading "Storage and Disposal.
- 2. Revise the Hazards to Humans & Domestic Animals as follows: "May be fatal if swallowed. Harmful if absorbed through the skin, or inhaled, or if in eyes. Do not breathe vapors, dust or spray mist. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Users and handlers must wear long-sleeved shirt and long pants, waterproof gloves, and shoes plus socks.
- 3. Delete the phrase, "This technical material should not be formulated for indoor use" because it contradicts with the use pattern, "Pets." Pets are considered an indoor use. Also, the use pattern should be listed as follows: "Pets (dogs and cats)."
- 4. Move the heading, "Active Ingredient" to the left margin with Inert Ingredients.

.iOTE TO PHYSICIAN: Carbaryl is a carbamate insecticide, which is a cholinesterase inhibitor. Overexposure to this substance may cause toxic signs and symptoms due to stimulation of the cholinergic nervous system. These effects of overexposure are spontaneously and rapidly reversible. Specific treatment consists of parenteral atropine sulfate. Caution should be maintained to prevent overatropinization. Mild cases may be given 1 to 2 mg intramuscularly every 10 minutes until full atropinization has been achieved, and repeated thereafter whenever symptoms reappear. Severe cases should be given 2 to 4 mg intravenously every 10 minutes until fully atropinized, then intramuscularly every 30 to 60 minutes to maintain the effect for at least 12 hours. Dosages for children should be appropriately reduced. Complete recovery from overexposure is to be expected within 24 hours. Narcotics and other sedatives should not be used. Further, drugs like 2-PAM (pyridine-2-aldoxime methicidide) are NOT recommended. To aid in the confirmation of a diagnosis, urine samples should be obtained within 24 hours of exposure, immediately frozen, and sent to an appropriate diagnostic laboratory for analysis.
