On the basis of information furnished by the registrant, the above named pesticide is hereby registered/reregistered under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act.

Registration is in no way to be construed as an endorsement or recommendation of this product by the Agency. In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act. The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

This product is conditionally registered in accordance with FIFRA sec. 3(c)(7)(A) provided that you:

- 1. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/ reregistration of your product under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(5) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data; and submit acceptable responses required for reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 4.
- 2. Make the following label changes:
 - a. Revise the EPA Registration Number to read, "EPA Reg. No. 46043-26".
 - b. Replace the statements above the "Directions for Use heading" with a "Chemical Hazards" heading along with the statements, "Do not mix this algicide with soap or other cleaners. Do not premixed with other water treating chemicals. These chemicals must be handled separately," to the label
 - c. Revise the second sentence in the first paragraph under the directions to state "the appropriate amount of product must be added by pouring directly into the pool along the edges while the filter and pump are in operation. To allow time for even distribution in pool water, bathers must allow 10 minutes after treatment before entering the pool."

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d. Under the "Directions for Use" add the subheading, "Initial Application" and the following statements:

(Free of Visible Algae/Start of Season): Apply 2 oz of this product per 5, 000 gallons of pool water (or equivalent) under sunny conditions for most effective results.

If algae growth is visible: Apply initial dose, then vacuum pool after 24 hours to remove dead algae.

If pool is heavy with algae growth, first brush algae spots, vacuum, clean and scrub the pool walls. Apply initial dose, then vacuum remaining algae debris.

- e. Add "Maintenance Dose" directions by stating "Apply 1 oz of product per 5,000 gallons of pool water (or equivalent) every 5 to 7 days. Note: After heavy or prolonged rainfall, high prevailing temperatures, or heavy swimming use, add the maintenance dose more frequently."
- f. Revise the "Precautionary Statements" to state "Harmful if swallowed. Prolonged or frequently repeated skin contact may cause allergic reactions in some individuals. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, or using tobacco."
- g. According to PR Notice 2001-1, the "First Aid" statements must be revised with the route of exposure of most concern as supported by the toxicity classification listed first. Therefore, reorganize the First Aid Statements to read "If Swallowed, If On Skin or Clothing, If in Eyes, then If Inhaled."
- h. The Agency has asked registrants to begin submitting "Master" labels which contain all the claims, use sites, directions, storage/disposal statements, and environmental hazard statements on one label. Based on the "Application for Pesticide," this product is sold in containers ranging from one pint to 5 gallons. You must revise your label to bring it into compliance with the above criteria for a "master label by addressing the following comments:

(containers less than 5 gallons)

Environmental Hazards:: Proposed label statements are acceptable.

(containers greater than 5 gallons)

Environmental Hazards: This product is toxic to fish and aquatic organisms. Do not discharge effluent containing this product into lakes, streams, ponds, estuaries, oceans, or other waters unless in accordance with the requirements of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit and the permitting authority has been notified in writing prior to discharge. Do not discharge effluent containing this product to sewer systems without previously notifying the local sewage treatment plant authority. This product comes concentrated. Dilute with at least nine parts of water before applying. Pour required amount into a plastic watering can, fill with water and sprinkle around edge of pool. Apply initial treatment to a freshly filled pool or at first visible signs of algae growth. Apply under sunny conditions for most effective results. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and discard it.
