DIRECTIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL CHLORINATION

For a new pool, start with a superchlorinate with 1.5 lbs. of this sodium hypochlorite solution for each 2500 gallons of water. This dosage is equivalent to 10 ppm available chlorine by weight.

For Pool Maintenance:
A. Adjust pool water pH to 7.2 to 7.6 range and maintain.
B. Add manually or by a feeder device this sodium hypochlorite solution at a rate of 1.5 lbs. of this sodium hypochlorite solution for each 2500 gallons of water will provide 10 ppm available chlorine by weight. Freely add this to maintain 0.6 to 1.0 ppm available chlorine at 78°F. temperature and 1000 hours of sunlight. The test kit must be used to maintain the residual chlorine level.

**DIRECTIONS FOR DISINFECTION OF POTABLE WATER
FOR HOME WELL WATER SYSTEMS**

Before this sodium hypochlorite solution is used, the water must be tested for iron, manganese, and hydrogen sulfide. If present, these must be removed first. Add this sodium hypochlorite solution at a rate of 1.5 lbs. of this sodium hypochlorite solution for each 2500 gallons of water will provide 10 ppm available chlorine by weight. Freely add this to maintain 0.6 to 1.0 ppm available chlorine at 78°F. temperature and 1000 hours of sunlight. The test kit must be used to maintain the residual chlorine level.

DIRECTIONS FOR SANITIZING FOOD PROCESSING OR DAIRY EQUIPMENT
Clean equipment in the normal manner. Just before using, the all surfaces thoroughly with this sodium hypochlorite solution containing 200 ppm available chlorine. Maintain contact with disinfectant for a minimum of two minutes. Do not rinse with water. After treatment with sodium hypochlorite solution, rinse with water overnight. Add 1.5 lbs. of this sodium hypochlorite solution for each 2500 gallons of water will provide approximately 200 ppm available chlorine by weight.

NOTE: This product degrades with age. Use a test kit to determine the available chlorine as necessary to obtain the required level. Avoid contact with skin.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Store in a cool, dry area away from direct sunlight. In case of spill, flood area with large quantities of water. If empty container is thoroughly washed with water and a fresh return to manufacturer or is placed in trash in a tightly sealed approved container. Do not reuse. Do not use if container is damaged. DIRECTIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL CHLORINATION

For a new pool, test spring water for pH. If pH is below 7.2, add 1 lb. of this sodium hypochlorite solution for each 25,000 gallons of water. This dosage is equivalent to 1 ppm available chlorine by weight.

For pool maintenance:
A. Adjust pool water pH to 7.2 to 7.6.
B. Add manually or by a feeder device this sodium hypochlorite solution at a rate to maintain an available chlorine level of 1.0 ppm. One half pint of this sodium hypochlorite solution for each 25,000 gallons of water will provide 1.0 ppm available chlorine by weight. For every 10,000 gallons of water, add 1.0 ppm available chlorine. This dosage is dependent on temperature and number of swimmers. Use test kit to determine the pH and available chlorine level of the pool water.

DIRECTIONS FOR DISINFECTION OF POTABLE WATER FOR HOME WELL WATER SYSTEMS

Disinfect 100 gallons of water with 1.0 pint of this sodium hypochlorite solution. Mix 1.0 pint of sodium hypochlorite solution and water thoroughly and feed into the water supply system with a hypochlorite solution pump. Maintain a free available chlorine level of at least 0.2 ppm and no more than 0.6 ppm throughout the distribution system as determined by a DDT chlorine test kit. After 24 hours, sample the water for taste and odor. If the water has a strong taste or odor, the chlorine level is too high. If the water has no taste or odor, the chlorine level is too low. Adjust the chlorine level accordingly.

DIRECTIONS FOR SANITIZING FOOD PROCESSING OR DAIRY EQUIPMENT
Clean equipment in the normal manner. Just before using, sanitize surfaces thoroughly with this sodium hypochlorite solution. Maintain a 200 ppm available chlorine level. Maintain contact with disinfectant for a minimum of two minutes. Then, rinse with water. After treatment with sodium hypochlorite solution, the equipment is safe to use. Add 1.0 pint of this sodium hypochlorite solution to 100 gallons of water. This will provide approximately 200 ppm available chlorine by weight.

NOTE: This product is a strong oxidizer. It will react with acids and other chemicals. It is not to be used in the presence of oil or grease.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Store in a cool, dry area away from direct sunlight. In case of spill, flood area with large quantities of water. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and return to manufacturer. Do not reuse. Do not place in trash. Collect and bury in an approved landfill.
