Special attention should be paid to cracks, hidden surfaces under sinks, behind stoves and refrigerators, food storage areas and whereve these pests are suspected of hiding. For control of ants, treat doors, windows sills, ant trails and other areas of entry. Repeat as necessary for control.

To Kill Carpet Beetles: Directly spray as many insects as possible. Spray both interior and exterior of upholstered furniture. Both top and bottom of rugs and carpets should be spraying thoroughly. Also treat shelves, closets, areas under furniture and wherever these insects are seen or suspected. Repeat as necessary.

To Kill Exposed Forms of confused Flour Beetles, Sawtoothed Grain Beetles, Lesser Grain Borer, and Rice Weevils: Find and destroy infested package goods. Remove all other items from pantry. Spray the shelves to kill any of the named insects present. Place clean paper on the shelves and return packages after shelves have dried. Repeat as necessary.

To Kill Wasps: Contact insects directly with spray. Sweep up and discard fallen wasps. Repat as necessary.

To Kill Fleas and Brown Dog Ticks: Remove and destroy old pet bedding. Spray sleeping quarters of pets, around baseboards, window and door frames, wall cracks and local areas of floors. Repeat as necessary. Do not spray animals. Put fresh bedding in pets quarters after spray has dried. Also treat dogs and cats with a registered flea and tick control product before allowing them to enter treated area.
