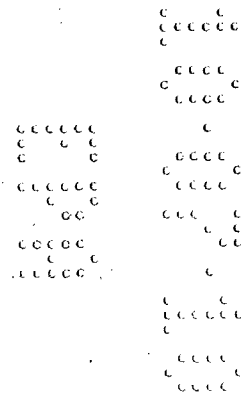

HAZARDS TO HUMANS & DOMESTIC ANIMALS

CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through the skin. Avoid breathing vapors or spray mist. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water. Obtain medical attention if irritation persists.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to fish. Keep out of lakes, streams or ponds. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

PHYSICAL AND CHEMICAL HAZARDS

Do not use, pour, spill or store near heat or open flame.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

For the protection of Dairy Animals from biting flies and the control of Houseflies in Barns and Milk Houses.

Protects against Hornflies, Stableflies, Houseflies, Gnats, Mosquitoes and Blood Sucking Lice.

A temporary treatment to relieve cattle from annoyance caused by face flies.

To protect dairy stock from hornflies, houseflies, stableflies, gnats and mosquitoes, spray after cattle enter the barn using 1 to 2 ounces per head, not to exceed 2 ounces per animal per day. The spray should be applied as a light mist primarily to envelop or hit the flies as they attempt to leave the cows.

For blood-sucking lice on cattle, apply the spray lightly to infested areas, not over 2 ounces per animal, and use a stiff brush on such areas to get the spray to the base of the hair. Treatment for lice should not be repeated more often than once every three weeks.

Space treatment in barns, houses and milk parlors for effective control of flies. Direct mist toward the upper portions of the enclosure, filling the air with fine spray particles, using approximately 2 ounces of material for each 1,000 cubic feet of space. Whenever possible keep doors and windows closed for 15 minutes after application. Cover milking utensils and milk to prevent contamination from spray and falling insects. Sweep up and destroy fallen insects.

Face fly spray - Apply to face of animal in morning while stanchioned, just before releasing to pasture. Use a spray which produces large wetting droplets. Apply sufficient material to wet the face of the animal, but do not exceed 1.5 ounces per animal. Repeat daily, or as necessary.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Store in a cool, dry, secure area. Store in original sealed container away from feed or feed.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Non-refillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. If empty, Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. If partly filled: Call your local solid waste agency for disposal instructions. Never place unused product down any indoor or outdoor drain.
