DIRECTIONS FOR USE (Cont'd.)

NOTE: For best insect control on vegetables plan on two applications the first and second week since this spray is not residual. A light mist on the plant foliage is all that is necessary. Do not spray to point of run-off.

INDOOR INSECT CONTROL

Adjust sprayer to give a fine "floating" mist as a space spray to control flies, Fruit Flies, Mosquitoes, Gnats, and Small Flying Insect Moths.

Cover or remove exposed food and food handling surfaces. Close windows, and doors and shut off ventilating systems. Direct the spray mist toward the upper portions of the enclosure filling the room with the mist and killing as many insects with the spray as possible.

Use 2 to 4 ounces per 1,000 cubic feet of space. Keep area closed for at least 30 minutes. Vacate treated areas and ventilate before reoccupying. Repeat treatment as necessary.

OUT-OF-DOORS ADULT MOSQUITO CONTROL

Apply as fine mist to thoroughly treat the entire area. For best results, treat when the wind velocity does not exceed 5 miles per hour (treat when it is calm). Treat shrubbery and vegetation where mosquitoes may rest particularly around mosquito breeding places such as swamps, marshes, stagnant pools and ponds. Apply at the rate of 4 ounce of this product per 1,000 square feet of area (5 to 6 quarts per acre).
