DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with the labeling

NOTE: Add HL 138D separately to the system, Do not mix it with other additives to avoid any possible incompatibilities

Water treated with HL-138D should not be used for food processing irrigation or in the manufacture of paper used for food packaging.

OPEN RECIRCULATING COOLING SYSTEMS: INITIAL DOSE: When microbiological slimes are evident, apply 4.7 to 9.3 fluid ounces of HL-138D per 1000 gations (7.5 ppm to 150 ppm) of water in the system. Repeat until control is achieved Badty fouled systems should be cleaned before treatment is begun. SUBSEQUENT DOSE. When microbiological control is evident, apply 3.1 to 6.2 fluid ounces of HL-138D per 1000 gattons (50 ppm to 100 ppm) of water in the system once per week, or as needed to maintain control.

FEEDING: HL-138D should be fed at full strength in the cooling towel basis at a point of maximum water circulating. Tower bleedoff valves should be closed to permit a retention time of 4 hours.

PAPER MILLS: Dosage will vary from 2.4 to 4.8 fluid ounces of HL-138D per ton of finished paper depending on the type of stock, complexity of the system, quality of raw water, and type and degree of contamination.

FEEDING: HL-138D may be drip fed continuously from the drum or led by suitable chemical pumps such as adjustable proportioning types; variable speed, positive displacement type, or by the reciprocating type. This product should be fed as early as possible in the system at such points including the hydropulper, machine chest or broke system.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT
