Dear Ms. Hatler:

The following amendment, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable with conditions.

Proposed Amendment:

- Label Amendment: Update First Aid, Directions for Use, and Container Disposal Statements per PR Notice 2007-4

Conditions

Revise your label as follows:

- 1.) Move Ingredients Statement to appear immediately after the product name.
- 2.) PR Notice 2005-1, Guidance for Mandatory and Advisory Labeling Statements, states that: "**Mandatory statements**, which commonly use imperative verbs such as "must" or shall," either require action or prohibit the user from taking certain action. **Advisory statements** generally provide information, either in support of mandatory statements or about the product in general. **To ensure that the intent of each labeling statement is clear, mandatory statements need to be clearly distinguishable from advisory statements.**" Therefore, you must revise the "Directions for Use" by deleting the terms, "should" and replace with "must."
- 3.) Revise the "Directions for Use" by adding the subheading "Maintenance Dose" where the sentence begins with "Subsequent additions..." on page 2.
- 4.) Add the heading, "Winterizing Directions," to precede the winter/off-season directions on page 3.

4) Revise the "Storage and Disposal" statements on page 3 to read as follows:

(Residential)

Storage and Disposal

Keep container in closed when not in use. Store in an area inaccessible to children and persons unfamiliar with its use. Leaking or damaged containers must be placed in a plastic bag and discarded in the trash. Mop up spills with clear water. Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. Offer for recycling if available. If not, discard in trash.

(Nonresidential)

Storage and Disposal

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal

Pesticide Storage: Keep container in closed when not in use. Store in an area inaccessible to children and persons unfamiliar with its use. Leaking or damaged containers must be placed in a plastic bag and discarded in the trash. Mop up spills with clear water.

Pesticide Disposal: Wastes resulting from the use of this product must be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.


Container Disposal: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. Triple rinse (or equivalent). Offer for recycling or reconditioning if available. If not puncture and dispose of container in a sanitary landfill or by procedures approved by state and local authorities.

Do not discharge effluent containing this product into sewer systems without previously notifying the local sewage treatment plant authority. For guidance contact your State Water Board or Regional Office of the EPA.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

POLY-60 is used to control the growth of algae in swimming pools, exterior spas, whirlpools, hot tubs, decorative fountains, and ponds that do not contain fish. For maximum effectiveness pools, spas, whirlpools, hot tubs, decorative fountains, and ponds containing heavy growth of algae should be shocked and cleaned prior to using **POLY-60**.

For pools having just visible algae growth, add an initial dose of 11 to 17 fluid ounces of **POLY-60** per 10,000 gallons of water and remove settled algae. For treatment of freshly cleaned and filled pools add initially 6 to 11 fluid ounces of **POLY-60** per 10,000 gallons of water. Subsequent additions of 2 to 4 fluid ounces of **POLY-60** per 10,000 gallons of water should be made every 5 to 7 days after initial treatment for maintenance.

Spas, whirlpools, hot tubs, decorative fountains and ponds having just visible algae growth require an initial dose of 1 to 2 fluid ounces of **POLY-60** per 1,000 gallons of water. For treatment of a freshly cleaned and filled spa, whirlpool, hot tub, decorative fountain or pond, add initially 0.6 to 1.1 fluid ounces of **POLY-60** per 1,000 gallons of water. Subsequent additions of 0.2 to 0.4 fluid ounces of

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POLY-60 per 1,000 gallons of water should be made every 5 to 7 days after initial treatment for maintenance.

{Optional winter and off-season Directions for Use}

[POLY-60 will prevent growth of most algae during the off-season winter months when pools are not in use. For pools which have been properly treated during the swimming season and are free of visible algae, add 6 to 10 fluid ounces of POLY-60 per 10,000 gallons of water. If at the end of swimming season pools have some visible algae growth, add 12 to 17 fluid ounces per 10,000 gallons. It is necessary that a uniform distribution of algacide throughout the water and the pool be made for maximum effectiveness. If pool is not covered, it may be necessary to repeat the treatment one or more times during the season.]

POLY-60 is compatible with those chemicals normally used to treat pools and spas and is effective at both acid and alkaline pH. POLY-60 can be used in pools and spas treated with chlorine chemicals and may reduce the amount of those chemicals normally required. However, do not mix POLY-60 with concentrated dry or liquid chlorine products.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL:

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Keep container closed when not in use. Leaking or damaged containers should be placed in a plastic bag and discarded in trash. Mop up spills with clear water. All pesticides should be kept out of reach of children and stored away from food.

{for non-residential and bulk shipments}

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law.
