c. Revise the Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals statement as follows:

Corrosive. Causes severe eye and skin damage. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or clothing. Wear goggles or face shield and use rubber gloves when handling. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the toilet. Maybe fatal if swallowed. Remove contaminated clothing before reuse.

[Biquanide Sanitizer] is a powerful cationic polymeric sanitizer which enables you to sanitize your pool without chlorine or bromine. When used as directed, your pool will stay bacteria and algae free. This product is designed to be used with the [Phoenix Biguanide System.]

TREATING THE POOL:

Pools Previously Treated with Chlorinating Chemicals: BIQUANIDE IS INCOMPATIBLE WITH CHLORINATING CHEMICAL PRODUCTS. Consult your ... authorized dealer of [Biquanide] for information on balancing your pool water. Check with chlorine test kit for free and combined chlorine prior to the beginning of neutralization. To destroy chlorine, add [DeChlor] per label directions of add 1 gallon of [Biguanide Super Shock (27% hydrogen peroxide)] per 10,000 gallons of pool water. Filter overnight. Check with chlorine test kit. If free chlorine is detected, repeat neutralizer treatment.

INITIAL DOSE:

Freshly Filled and Dechlorinated Pools: Backwash or clean pool filter. Check pH; adjust to 7.2 - 7.8 if necessary. Add 1/2 gallon of this product to 10,000





gallons of pool water to achieve a concentration of 50 ppm. After 24 hours check pH and concentration with the test kit and adjust if necessary.

MAINTENANCE DOSE:

Normal Pool Routine: Every week, check concentration and pH. Maintain concentration at about 50 ppm. Add at the rate of 1 pint (16 oz.) per 10,000 gallons of water to raise the concentration 10 ppm. The level should not drop below 30 ppm.

PROBLEM SOLVING AND SUPPLEMENT POOL INFORMATION:

NOTE: THIS PRODUCT AND CHLORINE ARE INCOMPATIBLE. Do not use in freestanding spas/hot tubs. Do not use in unpainted plaster pools previously exposed to metals which may cause staining. [Biguanide] is not compatible with many detergents and some supplemental algaecides (such as copper based).

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL:

Keep container closed when not in use. Store in original container in an area inaccessible to children. In case of a leak or a spill, soak up with an absorbent, such as sand, earth, or sawdust, and shovel into waste container. Remove waste to chemical waste area, and dispose of in accordance with local regulations.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: To dispose of excess product, securely wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.
