**DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Apply BRAVO ULTREX in sufficient water to obtain adequate coverage of foliage. Gallonage to be used will vary with crop and amount of plant growth. Spray volume usually will range from 20 to 150 gallons per acre for dilute sprays and 5 to 10 gallons per acre for concentrate ground sprays and aircraft applications. Both ground and aircraft methods of application are recommended unless specific directions are given for a crop.

Diseases	BRAVO ULTREX Rate per Acre	Application Directions
Fruit rots, Lophodermium leaf/twig blight	3.8 to 6.3 lb	Apply at early bloom and repeat at 10 to 14 day intervals. Under severe disease conditions use the 6.3 lb/acre rate on a 10 day schedule. DO NOT apply BRAVO ULTREX more than 3 times per season, or within 50 days before harvest. DO NOT apply to bogs when flooded or allow release of irrigation water from bogs for at least 3 days following application. BRAVO ULTREX may be applied through sprinkler irrigation equipment. Use 300 gallons of water per acre through solid set systems only. See calibration directions preceding this section.

Follow all applicable directions, restrictions, and precautions on the EPA-registered label.

NOTE: This labeling must be in the possession of the user at the time of pesticide application.
