STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Store in original container only in a cool, dry area inaccessible to children and pets. Keep container closed.

Do not reuse or refill this container. **If empty:** Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. **If partly filled:** Call your local solid waste agency for disposal instructions. DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

USE RESTRICTIONS:

This product is used to repel deer and elk from ornamentals, shrubs, roses, and conifer trees and seedlings. Use when plants are moist. Do not use this product on edible crops.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:

Apply a light dusting of powder to plants while they are moist from light rain or heavy dew. If plants are dry, give them a light misting from a suitable water sprayer before applying powder.

Apply powder to the parts of the plant to be protected from browsing. Do not apply too much powder as the excess will fall to the ground and be wasted.

Take care that the powder in the applicator does not become wet and clog the openings.

To protect against browsing of new growth, apply powder at the onset of browsing, but preferably after bud break and before new shoots exceed 1 inch in length. Do not re-treat new growth.

Roses: Slight discoloration of petals or leaves may result from the use of this product.

Conifer Trees: For large trees, apply only to lateral branches within animal's reach. Repeat as needed.

Conifer Seedlings: If only the terminal whorl is to be protected, apply approximately one gram of powder per seedling. To protect young seedlings from winter browsing,

apply repellent before onset of browsing. To protect against spring browsing of new growth, treat wet seedlings after bud break and before new shoots exceed 1 inch in length.

[To treat plants in nursery or field just before out planting: Using one bundle of conifer seedlings at a time, briefly immerse seedling tops in a bucket of water, then dust wet tops lightly with DEER AWAY® powder. Strive to deposit some powder on each seedling. Proceed with planting as usual.]

Note: Tying a 12” strip of plastic flagging immediately below terminal buds just prior to treatment may help to protect new growth after bud burst.
