STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Keep this product dry in a cool, dark place. Do not use if the container is damaged or if the product is discolored or has a strong odor.

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SWIMMING POOL WATER DISINFECTION

Chlorine with 65% available chlorine is designed to dissolve quickly and provide a ready source of available chlorine in swimming pools. Use according to directions. Chlorine controls algae, kills bacteria and other organisms in the pool. It also controls the growth of bacteria and other organisms in the pool.

Many chlorinated disinfectants are 2 ozs. per 10,000 gals. and increase the residual approximately 1 ppm per 10,000 gals. For the dosage and procedures recommended below.

DIRECTIONS FOR POOL USE: Always add 1/2 oz. between 7 and 7.5 for testing Chlorine.

START-UP: For initial chlorination of pool water add 6 ozs. per 10,000 gals. for 5 minutes for pools in and run test the chlorine level. If the chlorine level is below 1.0 ppm, add 1/2 oz. per 10,000 gals. for 5 minutes. Repeat until the chlorine level is 1.0 ppm.

SUPPLEMENTAL CHLORINATION (SHOCK), OF STABILIZED POOLS: For pools with 1.0 ppm chlorine level, add 1/2 oz. per 10,000 gals. for 5 minutes. Repeat until the chlorine level is 1.0 ppm.

CHLORINE TREATMENT FOR CONTROL OF ALGAE: If algae develops resulting in a green color and a slimy feeling, Chlorine treatment is necessary. Broadcast Chlorine over the entire pool surface. Use 1/2 oz. per 10,000 gals. for 5 minutes. Repeat until the chlorine level is 1.0 ppm.

NOTE: For proper contact with pool surfaces may cause staining or discoloring. Immediately after treatment thoroughly clean pool by scrubbing surface of algae growth with a brush and using a strong detergent. If necessary, repeat the treatment. Pool should be entered only when the chlorine residual is below 2.0 ppm.

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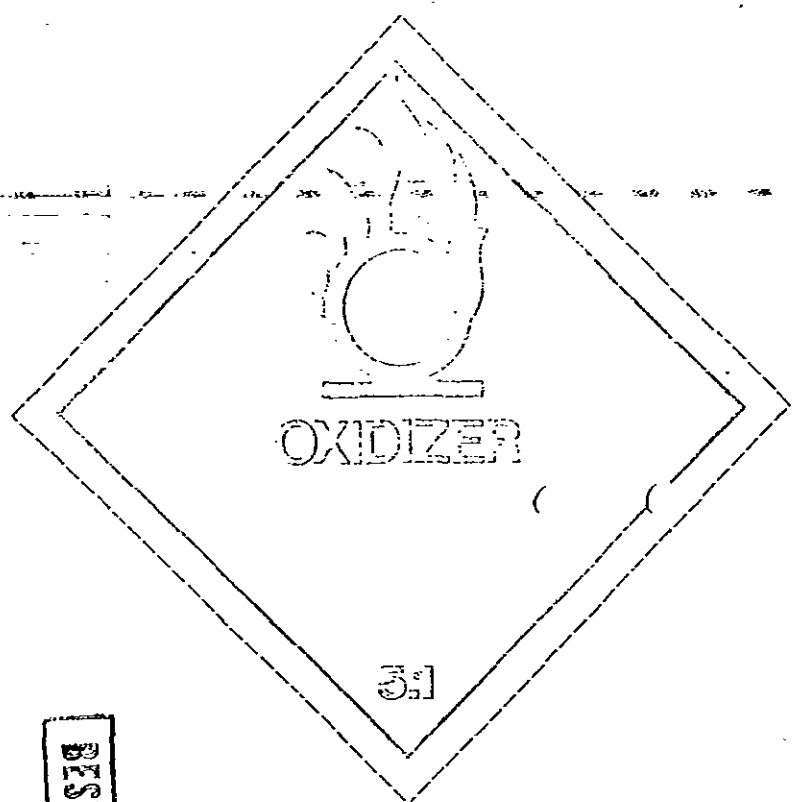
