The strong adhesive properties of Micro-Flo Sulfur act as a sticker on the plant, and the sticking characteristic necessitates the flushing of equipment with water after each day's use.

Dilute Application:

Ground: Specified rate in 20 to 60 gallons of water per acre.

Specified rate in 100 to 800 gallons of water per acre.

Concentrated Application:

Ground: Specified rate in 5 to 10 gallons of water per acre.

Orchard: Specified rate in 20 to 100 gallons of water per acre.

Aerial Application:

Ground: Specified rate in 3 to 20 gallons of water per acre. Orchard: Specified rate in 10 to 20 gallons of water per acre.

SPECIFIC RECOMMENDATIONS FOR VARIOUS CROPS CAUTION

Some crops may be damaged by sulfur under certain climatic conditions. Do not use on any crop unless sulfur has been shown to be safe in your locality. Do not allow spray to drift on to sulfur-sensitive crops such as apricots, cranberries, spinach and Anjou pears. Sulfur may burn foliage when temperature is high. Do not apply at such times. not use within two weeks of an oil spray treatment. For citrus, do not apply within 21 days of an oil spray. When growing crops for processing, consult the processor before applying sulfur.

RAPES: For control of powdery mildew, bud mite, blister mite and red spider mite. Mildew: Apply throughout the season at 14 days intervals according to the stage of development of the vegetation and intensity of the attack. Before flowering: Apply 7 pints per acre. After flowering: Apply 1 gal. per acre.

Mites: Apply 13 pints per acre at budburst, making sure to wet

thoroughly.

Note: Concord and other labrusca type grapes may be injured.

SØFT FRUIT:

Raspberries: For control of powdery mildew. Apply 2-1/2 gals. per

acre each week from first bloom to fruit set.

Strawbarries: For control of powdery mildew and red spider mite. Apply 13 pints per acre at early leaf stage and continue as necessary. Blackberries, boysenberries, dewberries, loganberries, blueberries, gooseberries, huckleberries and currants: For control of powdery mildew. Apply 2-1/2 gals. per acre before blossom and continue at 10 day intervals as necessary.

ORCHARDS:

Apples, pears: For control of powdery mildew, scab, blister mite and red/spider mite. Before flowering: Apply 5 gals. per acre.

flowering: Apply 2-1/2 gals. per acre. ttrus: For control of red spider mite, flat mite, rust mite and silver mite. Ground Application: Use 7 to 8 pts. of Micro-Fla Sulfur per 100 gallons of water. Aerial Application: Use 4 to 8 gals. per acre in sufficient water to provide adequate coverage. Peaches, plums, cherries, almonds, nectarines, prupes: For control of powdery mildew (except on almonds), brows rot, leaf spot, silver mite, flat mite and red spider mite. Apply 5 gals. per acre at bloom and repeat as necessary at intervals of 12 days.

Avocados: For control of brown mite. Apply 5 gals. per acre as needed.

... Mangoes: For control of powdery mildew. Apply 5 gals. per acre before flowering and continue at intervals of 20 days.

Malnuts: For control of pacific mite, almond mite, twospotted mite and red spider mite. Apply 3-1/3 gals. per acre as required.

PEANUTS: For control of powdery mildew, leaf spot and red spider mite. Apply 7 pts. per acre at early leaf stage and repeat at 18 days intervals.

SOYBEANS: For control of leaf spot and powdery mildew. Apply 2 gals. per acre at early leaf stage and repeat every 14 days as necessary.

SUGAR BEETS: For control of powdery mildew and red spider mite Apply 2/3 gal. per acre as required at 18 days intervals.

COTTON: For control of red spider mite. Apply 7 pts. per acre as necessary.

EREALS: Corn, wheat, barley, oats, rye, sorghum: For control of red spider mite, twospotted mite, pacific mite and atlantic mite. Apply 2-1/2 gals. per acre when mites first appear and continue as necessary.

VEGETABLES:

Beans: For control of leaf spot and powdery mildew. Apply 9 pts. per acre at early leaf stage and repeat every 14 days as necessary. Carrots: For control of powdery mildew and Petrobia mite. Apply 13 pts. per acre at early leaf stage and repeat every 14 days as necessary.

Broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, collards, kale,

mustard greens, rutabagas, peppers, turnips: For control of powdery
mildew and red spider mite. Apply 7 pts. per acre at early leaf stage
and repeat every 14 days as necessary.

Onions and garlic: For control of powdery mildew and Petrobia mite.

Apply 1 gal. per acre when disease first appears and repeat as

necessary.

Tomatoes: For control of russet mite. Apply 4 pts. per acre as necessary. Thorough coverage is required.

CUCURBITS: Melons, cucumbers, squash: For control of powdery mildew. Apply 4 gals. per acre when disease first appears and continue as necessary.

ORNAMENTALS AND ROSES: For control of powdery mildew and leaf spot. Apply 7 pts. in 100 gallons of water when disease first appears and repeat at 10 days intervals as required.

ORCHARDS:

Citrus: For control of red spider mite, flat mite, rust mite and itsilver mite. Ground Application: Use 7 to 8 pts. of Micro-Flowering: Sulfur per 100 gallons of water. Aerial Application: Use 4 to 8 gals. per acre in sufficient water to provide adequate coverage. Peaches, plums, cherries, almonds, nectarines, prumes: For control
