DIRECTIONS FOR DILUTION

The rates of water necessary to be added to the tank will vary with application method. The normal requirements for the following applications methods are as follows:

May be applied using ground or aerial equipment. For dilute ground sprays mix specified rate of this product and apply 300 to 600 gallons per acre for fruit and nuts (citrus may require up to 1500 gallons depending on tree sizes), and 10 to 30 gallons of water per acre for vegetables.

AERIAL APPLICATION: Use equivalent ground rates of this product in a minimum of 5 to 20 gallons of water per acre.

CONCENTRATE GROUND SPRAYS: Use equivalent rates of this product in a minimum of 50 to 200 gallons of water per acre.

*NOTE: The per acre rate of this product for concentrate and aerial is based upon dilute ground application with conventional equipment applying 300 to 600 gallons per acre. If directions call for 1 lb. of product per 100 gallons of water this amounts to 3 to 6 lbs. per acre when applied dilute, concentrate or aerial.

NOTE TO USER: Overspraying may cause injury to tender foliage of peaches, almonds, apricots and some Japanese plums.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Open dumping is prohib_ted. Do not reuse empty container.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

RECOMENDATIONS.

TOMATOES, PEPPERS AND POTATOES:

For the control of Early and Late Blight of potatoes and tomatoes, Septoria Leaf Spot of Tomatoes. Frogeye Spot of peppers, use 2

pounds per 100 gallons of spray. Begin spraying when diseases appear. Repeat every 3 to 7 days as needed.

CUCURBITS (Cucumbers, watermelons, cantaloupes, squash):
For the control of Downy Mildew use 2 pounds per 100 gallons of spray every 5 to 10 days as needed. Being spraying at first sign of disease.

CELERY:

For control of Early Blight use 2 to 4 pounds per 100 gallons of spray every 5 to 10 days as needed. Begin spraying at first sign of disease. Use higher races when disease pressure is severe.

CITRUS:

Use 1 1/2 pounds per 100 gallons spray solution in Petal Fall or Post Bloom applications for the control of Scab and/or Melanose. For dormant application for the control of Scab use 3 pounds per each 100 gallons spray.

NOTE: Basic Copper 53 is compatible with oil sprays used on citrus. The use of copper and oil combinations should be avoided after the fruit has attained a size of 3/4 inch in diameter and when the temperature is excessively high.
