Dear Mr. Talley:

The revised labeling referenced to above, submitted in connection with the registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) as amended, is acceptable, provided you incorporate the Agency's conditions as enumerated in this letter and submit one copy of your final printed label prior to releasing the product for shipment.

- 1. A statement of net content (i.e. Net Weight: 50 lbs) must appear on the label. Provided the retail size of your product is 50 lbs the phrase "restricted use pesticide" is not required on the product label.
- 2. You must delete field crickets from the front panel of the label because this pest was originally listed under flower beds, a use that was deleted in your July 5, 2000 submission. Mole crickets may remain on the label.
 - 3. As noted in our August 1, 2000 letter, the front panel of the label must be revised to state for "application to the soil surface of golf course turf and sod farm turf only."

The conditions of paragraph 5 of the June 2000 Memorandum of Agreement apply to this label amendment, specifically this amended label is effective Dec 1, 2000. Failure to comply with any of the conditions of registration set forth in Paragraph 10 the MOA shall be grounds for cancellation of the affected registration(s) under FIFRA section 6(e). Submit one copy of the revised final printed label before releasing the product for shipment. If the conditions enumerated above are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA Section 6(e).

IF SWALLOWED: Call a poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

IF IN EYES: Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

TO PHYSICIAN: Chlorpyrifos is a cholinesterase inhibitor. symptomatically. If exposed, plasma and red blood cell cholinesterase tests may indicate degree of exposure (baseline data are useful). Atropine, only by injection, is the preferable antidote. Oximes, such as 2-PAM/protopam, may be therapeutic if used early; however, use only in conjunction with atropine. case of severe acute poisoning, use antidotes immediately after establishing an open airway and respiration.

AS A BAIT TRPLIED TO THE SOIL OF FLOWER BEDS - For the control of ants, sow bugs, field and mole crickets, cutworms, earwigs, and darkling beetles, apply this product at the rate of 2-1/4 pounds to cover 1,000 square feet. Sprinkle over the soil area uniformly in areas where these insects are seen or are feeding. Replace bait as needed for centinued centrol. Apply approximately 100 pounds per acre. Apply in late afternoon when the soil is moist.

MOLE CRICKETS IN HIWNS, GOLF COURSES TURF AND SOD FARM TURF ONLY. OTHER ORNAMENTAL TURE— For control of mole crickets apply this granule product at the rate of 100 pounds per acre or 2-1/4 pounds per 1,000 sq. ft. Spread evenly over the area using a mechanical spreader. Apply in late afternoon on moist soil in areas known to be infested with these insects. Repeat application in about one week for best control.

The best time to control the Southern Mole Cricket: March through August - egg laying time February through September - adult mole crickets.
