Use Deletions of Dimethoate as Requested by the Agency

Your Submission Dated March 2, 2005

The label for the product referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided you make the following changes to the label:

- The Agency recommends that the Storage and Disposal statements be moved immediately after the last Directions for Use statement and before the Warranty Disclaimer.
- 2. Delete the following note appearing after the directions for use for potatoes since it is no longer applicable to the uses on the label, "*NOTE:

 Dimethoate 25 WP Insecticide may leave a visible deposit of powder on berries at maturity if treatment is made after berries reach ¼ inch in size. To avoid objectionable deposits of powder on berries grown for table and canning production, do not apply treatments to these crops after berries reach ¼ inch in diameter."

POTATOES: (Not For Use In California) Aphids, Leafminers, Leafhoppers - 1 to 2 lbs. per acre. Potatoes may be harvested on day of application. *NOTE: Dimethoate 25 WP Insecticide may leave a visible deposit of powder on berries at maturity if treatment is made after berries reach 1/4 inch in size. To avoid objectionable deposits of powder on berries grown for table and canning production, do not apply treatments to these crops after berries reach 1/4 inch in diameter.
