#### ALMONDS:

Shot hole - Apply 20-30 lbs per acre. Begin when buds start to swell in spring. Do not apply at or after full bloom.

#### APRICOTS:

Brown rot, Shot hole - Apply 20-30 lbs per acre. Do not apply at or after full bloom.

## CHERRIES, PLUMS:

Brown rot, - Apply 20-30 lbs per acre while at bud stage; Do not apply at or after full bloom.

#### PEACHES, NECTARINES:

Brown rot, Peach blight, Leaf curl - Apply 20-30 lbs per acre. Apply at dormant or delayed dormant stage. Do not apply at or

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after full bloom.

#### PEARS:

Fire blight - Apply 4 lbs per acre. Apply every 5-7 days starting at 10% bloom. The uses varies according to varieties and your Field Representative or State Extension Service should be consulted for recommendations.
