

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS—HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

DANGER: Corrosive, may cause severe skin irritation or chemical burns to broken skin. Causes eye damage. May be fatal if swallowed. Avoid breathing vapors. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Wear goggles or face shield and rubber gloves when handling this product. Wash hands after handling. Vacate poorly ventilated areas as soon as possible. Do not return until odors have dissipated.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: This pesticide is toxic to fish, keep out of lakes, streams or ponds. Treated effluent cannot be discharged into lakes, streams, ponds or public waters unless a discharge permit is obtained. For guidance, contact the regional office of the Environmental Protection Agency.

PHYSICAL AND CHEMICAL HAZARDS: STRONG OXIDIZING AGENT: Mix only with water according to label directions. Mixing this product with gross filth such as feces, urine, etc., or with ammonia, acids, detergents or other chemicals will release hazardous gases irritating to eyes, lungs and mucous membranes.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Store in a cool, dry area away from direct sunlight. In case of spill, flood areas with large quantities of water. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and either return to manufacturer or discard by placing in trash collection or burying in an approved land fill. Product or rinsate that cannot be used, should be diluted with water and disposed of in a sanitary sewer. Do not contaminate food or feed by storage, disposal or cleaning of equipment.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE—GENERAL CLASSIFICATION

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

DIRECTIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL CHLORINATION

For a new pool or for spring start-up, superchlorinate with one (1) pint (16 flu. ozs.) of GIBBONS chlorinating solution for each 3300 gallons of water. This dosage is equivalent to 5 ppm available chlorine by weight.

FOR POOL MAINTENANCE:

A) Adjust pool water pH to 7.6-7.2 range and maintain.

B) Add GIBBONS chlorinating solution manually or by a feeder device at a rate to maintain an available chlorine residual of 0.6 to 1.0 ppm. One-half pint (8 flu. ozs.) of Shock Plus chlorinating solution for each 8000 gallons of water will provide 1.0 ppm available chlorine by weight. Frequency of additions to maintain 0.6 to 1.0 ppm available chlorine will depend on temperature and number of swimmers. Use test kit to make certain the pH and chlorine residual are in the proper range.

FOR POOL SHOCK:

A) Adjust pool water pH to 7.2-7.6 range.

B) Add manually or by feeder device at the rate of 10 flu. ozs. per 1000 gallons of pool water. This will establish 10 ppm of available chlorine by weight. Do not enter pool until chlorine residuals drop between 1.0 to 1.5 ppm as determined by a test kit.

NOTE: This product degrades with age. Use a chlorine test kit and increase dosage, as necessary to obtain the required level of available chlorine.
