The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable. A stamped copy is enclosed for your records.

1. Although we would prefer inclusion, we have determined that it is acceptable to remove the statement "If you go to a doctor, take this repellent with you" from the product label. You may remove this statement from the label without submitting an amendment.
2. Delete the phrase "...apply liberally...". This wording is inconsistent with the remainder of text in the LIP.

**DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

**It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a  
manner inconsistent with its labeling.**

**Read all directions before using this product.**

**To repel the insects listed on the Front Panel, apply  
liberally to all exposed skin areas. To apply to face, spray  
on hands and rub on. Repeat as needed. For ticks and  
chiggers, also apply liberally to shoe tops, socks, and  
around openings in clothing.**

Do not spray in enclosed areas.

Do not apply over cuts, wounds, or irritated skin.

Do not apply to eyes and mouth and do not apply to the hands of young children. Do not spray directly of face.

Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin and/or clothing. Do not use under clothing. Avoid overexposure. Frequent reapplication and saturation is unnecessary for effectiveness.

After returning indoors, wash treated skin with soap and water. Was treated clothing.

Use of this product may cause skin reactions in rare cases. If you suspect that you or your child is reacting to this product, wash treated skin and call your local poison control center. If you go to a doctor, take this repellent with you.

Avoid contact with plastics, such as eyeglass frames, and such fabric as acetate rayon.

#### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

**Storage:** Store in a cool, dry area away from heat or open flame.

**Disposal:** Do not re-use empty container. Wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash. Do not puncture or incinerate.

#### PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

##### CAUTION

##### Hazards To Humans and Domestic Animals

Causes eye irritation. Harmful if swallowed. Avoid contact with eyes or lips. Instruct older children in the proper use of this product and keep it from infants and young children. Do not let children rub their eyes if hands have been treated.

### PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS

**EXTREMELY FLAMMABLE:** Contents under pressure. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Do not puncture or incinerate container. Exposure to temperatures above 130F may cause bursting.
