DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

To Kill Ear Mites: Clean ears to remove built-up wax and dirt. While firmly holding pet, fill ear canal with recommended number of drops in each ear. Massage base of ear to insure insecticidal action penetrates ear wax. Gently dry ear with a cotton ball, soft cloth, or cotton swab. This product may be applied daily for 7 to 10 days. Repeat treatment in two weeks if necessary.

<u>Body Weight</u>	<u>Dosage</u>
5 to 15 lbs.	4 to 5 drops
15 to 30 lbs.	5 to 10 drops
30 lbs. & over	10 to 15 drops

If condition for which this preparation is used persists or if an irritation develops, discontinue use and consult a veterinarian.

For use with a swabstick: Open packet, remove swabstick. While firmly holding pet, fill ear with liquid from packet. Massage base of ear to insure that insecticidal action penetrates ear wax. Use swabstick to remove as much waxy exudate as possible from the outer ear. **IMPORTANT:** Do not use the swabstick for the inner ear (i.e. Swab part should always be visible!) This product may be applied daily for 7 to 10 days. Repeat treatment in two weeks if necessary.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Storage: Store in a cool, dry area, away from heat or open flame.

Disposal: Do not reuse empty container. Wrap and put in trash.
