



DANGER—POISON—PRECAUTIONS

CAN KILL YOU IF SWALLOWED

This product can kill you if swallowed even in small amounts. spray mist or dust may be fatal if swallowed.



CAN KILL YOU BY SKIN CONTACT

This product can kill you if touched by hands or spilled or splashed on skin. In eyes or on clothing liquid goes through clothes.



CAN KILL YOU IF BREATHED

This product can kill you if vapors, spray mist or dust are breathed.

POISONOUS TO FISH AND WILDLIFE

This product is toxic to fish and wildlife. Birds and other wildlife in treated areas may be killed. Keep out of any body of water. Do not apply when weather conditions favor drift from treated areas. Do not apply where runoff is likely to occur. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

USE ONLY WHEN WEARING THE FOLLOWING PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT AND CLOTHING

- (1) Wear water proof pants, coat, hat, rubber boots or rubber overshoes; (2) Wear safety goggles; (3) Wear mask or respirator approved by the U.S. Bureau of Mines for parathion protection; (4) Wear heavy duty natural rubber gloves.

WORK SAFETY RULES

Keep all unprotected persons and children away from treated area or where there is danger of drift.

Wash hands with soap and water if you feel you may have come in contact with hands. If you feel you may have come in contact with eyes, stop work and get help right away. Call a doctor, physician, clinic or hospital—immediately. Explain that the victim has been exposed to parathion and describe his condition. After first aid is given (see First Aid Treatment Section) and if a doctor cannot come take victim to clinic or hospital.

IMPORTANT! Before removing gloves, wash them with soap and water. Always wash hands, face and arms with soap and water before smoking, eating or drinking.

AFTER WORK take off all work clothes and shower using soap and water. Wear only clean clothes when leaving job. Do not wear contaminated clothing. Wash protective clothing and protective equipment with soap and water after each use. Respirator should be cleaned and filter replaced according to instructions included with respirator.

POISON SIGNS (Symptoms)

Parathion is a very dangerous poison. It rapidly enters the body on contact with all skin surfaces and eyes. Clothing wet with this material must be removed immediately. Exposed persons must receive prompt medical treatment or they may die.

Some of the signs and symptoms of poisoning are Headache, nausea, vomiting, cramps, weakness, blurred vision, pin point pupils, tightness in chest, labored breathing, nervousness, sweating, watering of eyes, drooling or frothing of mouth and nose, muscle spasms and coma.

♦ FIRST AID TREATMENT ♦

Call a doctor (physician), clinic or hospital immediately. Explain that the victim has been exposed to parathion and describe his condition.

If breathing has stopped, start artificial respiration immediately and maintain until doctor sees victim. If swallowed and victim is awake (conscious) make him vomit quickly. Induce vomiting by striking higher down throat or by giving soapy or strong salty water to drink. Repeat until vomit is clear. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Have victim lie down and keep quiet. See doctor immediately.

In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. See doctor immediately.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

Antidote—administer atropine sulfate in large doses, TWO to FOUR mg. intravenously or intramuscularly as soon as consciousness is overcome. Repeat at 5 to 10 minute intervals until signs of atropinization appear. 2-PAM chloride is also antidotal and may be administered in conjunction with atropine. DO NOT GIVE MORPHINE OR TRANQUILIZERS. Parathion is a strong cholinesterase inhibitor affecting the central and peripheral nervous systems and producing cardiac and respiratory depression. At first sign of pulmonary edema, the patient should be given supplemental oxygen and treated symptomatically. Continued absorption of the poison may occur and fatal relapses have been reported after initial improvement. VERY CLOSE SUPERVISION OF THE PATIENT IS INDICATED FOR AT LEAST 48 HOURS.

POST TREATED AREA

PEARS: Spider mites (common red, two-spotted), mealybugs and aphids — use 35-50 pounds per acre in one or two applications, depending on warrants. In case of the red-banded leaf roller, repeat application may be required as brood larvae hatch. CAUTION: Parathion may be applied to fruit and foliage of McIntosh apples and related varieties no closer than 14 days prior to harvest.

PEAS: Spider mite (common red and two-spotted), bean leaf beetle, corn earworm, Mexican bean beetle, leaf hopper and armyworm — use 15 pounds per acre. Repeat application if infestation persists no closer to harvest than 15 days.

CARROTS: Root maggot, rootworm, cutworm, wireworm, crown borer, root-knot nematode, aphids and vegetable weevils — use 15 pounds per acre. Repeat application if infestation persists no closer to harvest than 15 days. Do not use for feed or feed animals.

CHICORY: Root maggot, rootworm, wireworm, aphids, two-spotted spider mite — use 15 pounds per acre. Repeat applications when necessary. Last application no closer than 14 days.

PEPPERMINT: Leaf miner (two spot) — use 30-50 pounds per acre on mature plants. Repeat in 5 to 7 days. Last application no closer to harvest than 10 days.

OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING USE PRECAUTIONS

Observe use limitations given for specific crops.

DON'T APPLY DURING BLOOM when honey bees or other pollinators are present. Avoid drift to adjoining food and forage crops about to be harvested or in bloom.

This product is highly toxic to bees and other insect pollinators exposed to direct treatment or residues on crops. Protective information may be obtained from your cooperative Agricultural Extension Service.

Consult state and county agricultural extension service authorities for information concerning local conditions.

DO NOT STORE WITH FOODSTUFFS

DO NOT REUSE — Use Strictly in Accordance with Label Cautions, Warnings and Directions

Do not apply to crops not specified on label.

Rinse equipment and containers and dispose of wastes by burying in non-crop lands away from water supplies. Containers should be disposed of by puncturing holes in them and burying with wastes, or by burning (keep out of smoke).

Do not apply when weather conditions favor drift of spray from areas treated.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Applications should be made only by experienced personnel using approved safety equipment.

Pour recommended amount of this material into nearly filled spray tank, add balance of water to fill tank. Keep agitator running during filling, mixing and spraying operations.

When spraying with boom sprayers and other power equipment, use a minimum of 100 gallons of water per acre or more if equipment and economy permit. Thorough coverage of all foliage and stems is essential for good control.

Do not combine emulsifiable H.D. with wettable powders in the same spray tank unless previous use of the materials being combined has proved them to be compatible.

Airplane applications use minimum of 10 gallons of water per acre. Where equipment and economy permit, use 20 gallons.

PEARS: Spider mites (common red and two-spotted), Pear psyll, mealybugs and aphids — use 35-50 pounds per acre. Last application no closer to harvest than 10 days.

PEAS: (field grown only). Aphids and Pea weevil — use 15 pounds per acre. For weevil control apply to foliage during early bloom period before eggs are laid, and repeat in 5 days. Last application no closer to harvest than 15 days if plants are to be fed to livestock. Otherwise last application may be 10 days prior to harvest.

POTATOES: Aphids, Blister beetle, Leafhoppers, Leaf miners and Potato psyllid — Apply to foliage as needed, use 15-25 pounds per acre. Last application no closer to harvest than 5 days.

SUGAR BEETS: Beet leafhopper, Aphids, Leaf miners, Lygus bugs and webworms — use 25 pounds per acre on foliage as needed. Repeat application if infestation warrants it. Last application no closer to harvest than 15 days.

TOMATOES: Aphids, Leaf miner and Spider mites (two-spot) — use 30 pounds per acre. Last application no closer than 10 days before harvest.
