**DIRECTIONS FOR POOL USE
To Establish a Chlorine Residual**

Add 1/2 gallon for each 10,000 gallons of water. Repeat dosage until a residual of 0.6 to 1.0 ppm is obtained.

The pool water should be maintained at PH 7.2 to 7.6 as determined by test kit.

Daily Chlorination

Add 32 oz. for each 10,000 gallons of pool water daily or as needed to maintain 0.6 to 1.0 ppm chlorine residual at all times in unstabilized pools that have been stabilized with cyanuric acid, a chlorine residual of 1 ppm should be maintained at all times.

The quantity of daily addition will vary with temperature, sunlight, bath and other factors. Test pool water frequently with a chlorine test kit to maintain the desired chlorine residual. Bathers should not be allowed in when the residual chlorine is above 2.0 ppm.

Super Chlorination

Purposes: For effective algae control, a regular program of superchlorination at least once a week, preferably at night while pool is not in use should be maintained.

Directions: Add 1 gallon for each 20,000 gallons of pool water direct to pool water.

NOTE: This product degrades with age. Use a chlorine test kit and dosage, as necessary, to obtain the required level of available chlorine.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Store in a cool, dry area from direct sunlight. In case of spill, flood area with large quantities of water. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and either return to manufacturer or discard by placing in trash collection or burying in an approved site. Product or residue that cannot be used, should be diluted with water and disposed of in a sanitary sewer. Do not contaminate food or feed by storage or disposal or cleaning of equipment.

Super Chlorination
