Dear Ms. Swick:

The following amendment, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable with the conditions listed below:

- Update the "Precautionary Statements" section of the label
- Update the "First Aid" section in accordance with PR Notice 2001-1
- Delete the statement "Available Chlorine. . . . 126%"
- Add the phrase "... or non-oxidizable materials" to the "Chemical/Physical Hazards" section
- Delete the word "mechanical" from the "Directions for Use" section

Conditions

Revise the label as follows:

1. Update the First Aid statement to include the language Per PR Notice 2001-1 to include "If Inhaled: Move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth if possible. Call poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice."

FIRST AID
