DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

BPI 6110

is used in recirculating cooling tower systems and industrial microbiological slime. Prior to the use of BPI 6110 in industrial and/or commercial recirculating cooling towers, clean to remove algal growth, microbiological slime, and initial slug addition of 12.0 to 17.9 fl. oz. of BPI 6110 per 1000 gal. of water to provide 100 to 150 ppm, based on total weight of water in the system until control is evident. Make subsequent slug addition of BPI 6110 per 1000 gal. of water every 2 to 5 days. The frequency of addition depends upon the relative amount of biological problem. Slug additions should be made to the recirculating tower systems.

BPI 6110

is used in which maintain effective mist-eliminating components. Clean to remove bacterial slime and other deposits. A slug addition of 35.9 fl. oz. of BPI 6110 per 1000 gal. of water is recommended. Repeat initial dosage until control is evident. A slug addition of 21.0 to 35.9 fl. oz. of BPI 6110 per 1000 gallons of water should be employed every 1 to 5 days. The frequency of addition depends upon the relative amount of bleedoff and biological problem. Slug additions may be made to the sump or the water treatment system.

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STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

STORAGE: Do not expose to extreme temperatures. Do not stack more than 10 drums. Drums should be placed in overpack drums for disposal. Spills should be cleaned up in a sanitary landfill. Keep container closed when not in use.
