



3. Change the First Aid section to read:

FIRST AID	
<b>If in eyes:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes.</li> <li>•Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye.</li> <li>•Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.</li> </ul>
<b>If swallowed:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Call poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice.</li> <li>•Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow.</li> <li>•Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by the poison control center or doctor.</li> <li>•Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.</li> </ul>

5. Revise the Directions for Use section as follows:

**“Directions for Use**

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

**Read and follow all directions and precautions on this product label before using this product.**

**General Precautions and Restrictions:**

For outdoor use only. Do not spray or use in enclosed areas. Never use repellents over cuts, wounds, or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth, and apply sparingly around ears. When using sprays, do not spray directly into face; spray on hands first and then apply to face. Do not allow children to handle this product, and do not apply to children’s hands. When using on children, apply to your own hands and then put it on the child. Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin and/or clothing. Do not use under clothing. Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin and/or clothing. Heavy application and saturation is unnecessary for effectiveness; if biting insects do not respond to a thin film of repellent, apply a bit more. After

returning indoors, wash treated skin with soap and water or bathe. This is particularly important when repellents are used repeatedly in a day or on consecutive days. Also, wash treated clothing before wearing it again. **Use of this product may cause skin reactions in rare cases. If you suspect a reaction to this product, discontinue use, wash treated skin, and call your local poison control center. If you go to a doctor, take this product with you.**

**Application Instructions:**


Aim arrow on valve toward skin or clothing surface to be sprayed. Hold container 6-8 inches from the skin or clothing surface and depress valve. Apply to all exposed skin and clothing areas except face. To apply to face, spray a small quantity on hands and spread on face. For ticks and chiggers apply to clothing openings and cuffs.”

- 6. To be eligible for reregistration, aerosol and pump spray formulations must be packaged in containers utilizing a concave trigger to help aim product or other comparable mechanism that will ensure that the product will not be inadvertently sprayed in the eyes.
- 7. Submit a revised The Confidential Statement of Formula (CSF) for this product. (Discussed in a separate letter).
- 8. The Agency is in the process of developing and improving the current Efficacy Assessment Guidelines for repellent products. The Agency intends to defer the determination of any related efficacy data requirements supporting the claims that may appear on this label until these Efficacy Assessment Guidelines are complete. When the guidelines are finalized, the Agency expects to issue a Data Call-In to address the revised guidelines to all registrants with registrations for personal repellent products that have not previously submitted efficacy data sufficiently consistent with the revised guidelines.

You must submit two copies of the finished label revised in accordance with the comments listed above before the product is released for shipment under this label.

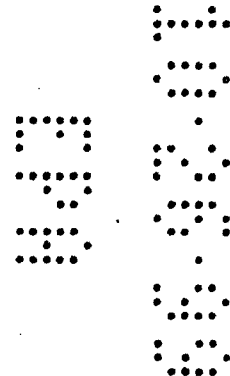
