Dear Mr. Dickens:

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable with the following provision(s):

General Statement:

1. Delete all text throughout the label marked with "strikethrough."

Optional Marketing Claims section comment(s): 1

- 2. Revise optional marketing claim #1 to read: "Up to 8 hours of mosquito protection."
- 3. Remove Eastern equine Encephalitis, Lacrosse Encephalitis, Cache Valley Encephalitis and Venezuelan equine Encephalitis from optional marketing claim #2. These diseases are not established in the U.S. or suitable vectors have not been tested.
- 4. Remove European Tick Borne Encephalitis from optional marketing claim #3. This disease is not established in the U.S. or suitable vectors have not been tested.
- 5. Delete optional marketing claim #4. This disease (Onchocerciasis) is not established in the U.S. or suitable vectors have not been tested.
- 6. Revise optional marketing claim #5 to read: "Protection [you can count on for up to 8 hours] [from mosquitoes that may carry West Nile Virus]."
- 7. Delete optional marketing claim #13. Long lasting is ambiguous.
- 8. Delete optional marketing claim #18. Claims against vectors of specific diseases are acceptable. For this claim, the vector(s) cannot be identified.
