DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

CQ 1433-B

is used for recirculating cooling tower systems and industrial microbiological slime. Prior to the use of CQ 1433-B,

industrial and/or commercial recirculating cooling towers should be cleaned to remove algal growth, microbiological slime, and other deposits. Initial slug addition of 4.5 to 6.8 fl. oz. of CQ 1433-B per 1000 gal. of water to provide 40 to 60 ppm,

based on total weight of water in the system until control is evident. Make subsequent slug additions of

CQ 1433-B

per 1000 gal. of water (CQ 1433-B) every 2 to 3 days. The frequency of addition depends upon the relative amount of microbiological problem. Slug additions should be made to all recirculating cooling tower systems.

CQ 1433-B

is used for industrial and/or commercial recirculating cooling towers which maintain effective mist-eliminating components. Cleaned to remove bacterial slime and other deposits.

13.6 fl. oz. of CQ 1433-B

is recommended. Repeat initial dosage until control is evident. Initial dosage of 7.9 to 13.6 fl. oz. of CQ 1433-B

per 1000 gallons of water should be employed every 1 to 5 days. The frequency of addition depends upon the relative amount of bleedoff and microbiological problem. Slug additions may be made to the sump or the water treatment system.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL
