The amended labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) notes that you have submitted labeling that includes the sublabel for the inert training canister that contains no active ingredient. As noted in the EPA's Label Review Manual (LRM), Chapter 18, Section IV(A), the EPA has jurisdiction over the packaging and labeling of any "non-pesticide" which is part of the package (refer to 40 CFR 152.3). The EPA has reviewed your inert training canister sublabel and deemed it acceptable; however, the sublabel of your master label that contains this inert training canister label (pages 13-15) will not be part of the FIFRA stamped label. This determination is based on the EPA's LRM, Chapter 19, Section IV(A), which indicates, "The reviewer examines the non-pesticide labeling to determine whether it contains any language that conflicts with the pesticide label, but the reviewer does not actually stamp the non-pesticide label." Although the inert training canister label is not part of the FIFRA stamped label, if you decide to make changes to this label, you must submit it to the EPA for review.

This approval does not affect any terms or conditions that were previously imposed on this registration. You continue to be subject to existing terms or conditions on your registration and any deadlines connected with them.

A stamped copy of your labeling is enclosed for your records. This labeling supersedes all previously accepted labeling. You must submit one (1) copy of the final printed labeling before you release this product for shipment with the new labeling. In accordance with 40 CFR § 152.130(c), you may

distribute or sell this product under the previously approved labeling for 18 months from the date of this letter. After 18 months, you may only distribute or sell this product if it bears this new revised labeling or subsequently approved labeling. "To distribute or sell" is defined under FIFRA section 2(gg) and its implementing regulation at 40 CFR § 152.3.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to your company's website on your label, then please be aware that the website becomes labeling under FIFRA and is subject to review by the EPA. If the website is false or misleading, the product will be considered to be misbranded and sale or distribution of the product is unlawful under FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(E). 40 CFR § 156.10(a)(5) lists examples of statements the EPA may consider false or misleading. In addition, regardless of whether a website is referenced on your product's label, claims made on the website may not substantially differ from those claims approved through the registration process. Therefore, should the EPA find or if it is brought to our attention that a website contains false or misleading statements or claims substantially differing from the EPA-approved registration, the website will be referred to the EPA's Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance.
