

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this pesticide in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

GLACIDE 530 is used in industrial cooling tower systems and industrial air-washing systems. Prior to the use of GLACIDE 530 in recirculating cooling tower systems, systems should be cleaned to remove microbial slime, and other deposits. Then make an addition of 3.0 fl. oz. of GLACIDE 530 to 20 to 30 ppm of GLACIDE 530 of water in the system. Repeat initial dosage until complete bleedoff and the severity of the microbiological problem is controlled. Additions may be made to the sump or the water.

GLACIDE 530 is used in industrial waterflooding operations. In systems fouled with bacteria, including sulfate-reducing organisms, GLACIDE 530 should be added as a slug of 8 to 16 ppm (0.83 to 1.66 per 1000 gal. of water treated). This should be done employing a concentration of 8 ppm, based on total water and continuous addition of GLACIDE 530 heater-treater dump, gathering lines, or receiving lines upstream to the filter.

GLACIDE 530 is also used in water-based drilling muds, completion fluids containing starch, gums, sugar, and other additives. GLACIDE 530 is added to the mud at a concentration of 0.06 to 0.12 gal. per 100 barrels of fluid.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal. STORAGE: Do not expose to extreme temperatures. Do not store drums should be placed in overpack drums for disposal. Spills should be cleaned up immediately. Keep container closed when not in use.
