We have reviewed your submission of Vovember 19, 1996. The label submitted on that date is acceptable provided that you comply with the conditions stipulated below.

- 1. In the "RESTRICTED USE FESTICIDE" box, change "DUE TO HIGH ACUTT TOXICITY" to "DUE TO HAZARD TO NONTARGET ORGANISMS". The latter wording is adapted from text in <u>40 CFR</u>, §152.175, which pertains exclusively to burrow-builder applications of Strychnine baits.
- 2. To the "USE RESTRICTIONS" paragraph of the "DIRECTIONS FOR USE", add the sentences shown immediately below.

"This product may not be applied above the ground surface. All applications of this product must be made directly into subterranean artificial burrow systems by use of machinedrawn mechanical burrow builders."

3. Submit one copy of final printed labeling for our files before releasing this product for shipment.

If less than ten (10) minutes have passed since the poison was taken, give 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. Repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Have pattent lie down in quiet, darkened room and keep him warm and quiet. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
