The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended to update your label will be acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended label.

Under the heading "Environmental Hazards" add the following statements:

"This pesticide is toxic to fish. Do not discharge effluent containing this product into lakes, streams, ponds, estuaries, oceans or other water unless in accordance with the requirements of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit and the permitting authority has been notified in writing prior to discharge. Do not discharge effluent containing this product to sewer systems without previously notifying the local sewage treatment plant authority. For guidance contact your State Water Board or Regional Office of the EPA".

A stamped copy of your labeling is enclosed for your records. Submit one (1) copy of the final printed label prior to release of the product for shipment.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT: In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. For eyes, call a physician. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse. If swallowed, call a physician or Poison Control Center. Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

TB-65 is used to control algae and bacteria in recirculating cooling towers. Prior to its use, systems must be cleaned of biological slime, and other deposits. An initial slug addition of 1.7 to 10.2 fluid ounces per 1000 gallons of water is recommended. Repeat initial

Subsequent slug additions of 1.7 to 10.2 fluid ounces should be employed every 1 to 5 days, or as needed. The frequency of the relative amount of bleedoff and the severity of the microorganisms should be made in the sump of water cooling towers.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

STORAGE: Do not expose to extreme temperatures. Do not store in unventilated areas. Drums should be opened in well-ventilated areas. Leaking drums should be placed in overpack drums for disposal. Spills should be absorbed and disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Keep container closed when not in use.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are toxic. Improper disposal of spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If the pesticide cannot be used according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at your EPA Regional Office.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL:

- METAL: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reuse, and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by local authorities.
- PLASTIC: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reuse, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, by incineration, or by other procedures approved by local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.
