DIRECTIONS FOR USE

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TB-65 is used to control algae and bacteria in recirculating commercial and industrial water cooling towers. Prior to its use, systems must be cleaned to remove algal g.c.wth, microbio-logical slime, and other deposits. An initial slug addition of 5-1-to 16.2 fluid cunces of TB-65 per 1000 gallons of water is recommended. Repeat initial dosage until control is evident.

Subsequent slug additions of 1.7 to 10.2 fluid ounces of TB-65 per 1000 gallons of water should be employed every 1 to 5 days, or as needed. The frequency of addition depends upon the relative amount of bleedoff and the severity of the microbiological problem. Slug additions should be made in the sump of water cooling towers.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

STORAGE: Do not expose to extreme temperatures. Do not stack more than five drums high. Drums should be opened in well-ventilated areas. Leaking or damaged drums should be placed in overpack drums for disposal. Spills should be absorbed in sawdust or sand and disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Keep container closed when not in use.
