DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.
FUEL PRESERVATION: For control of non-public health bacterial and fungal growth in the following liquid hydrocarbon fuels and oils (crude oil, diesel fuel, residual fuel oils, coal slurries, liquefied petroleum gases, kerosene and petrochemical feedstocks) add a slug dose of 50 - 100 ppm Amerstat 25DM. Repeat as needed to gain control.

To maintain control, feed 25 - 50 ppm (1-25,000 dilution) Amerstat 25DM once a month or as needed. Should disposal of tank bottom water become necessary, wait at least 48 hours after last Amerstat 25DM treatment before draining tank. Do not discharge water directly to ground where it can enter streams, lakes or ponds.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Protect from freezing and temperatures in excess of 140°F. Keep container closed when not in use. If contents are spilled or leaked due to container damage, collect liquid with absorbent material and dispose of in accordance with local, state and federal pesticide disposal regulations.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label directions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL:

Nonrefillable containers equal to or less than 5 gallons - Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Fill the container ¼ full with water and recap. Shake for 10 seconds. Pour rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Repeat this procedure two more times. Then offer for recycling if available or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration.

Nonrefillable container greater than 5 gallons - Do not reuse or refill this container. Offer for recycling if available or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration.

Metal Containers - Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities.
