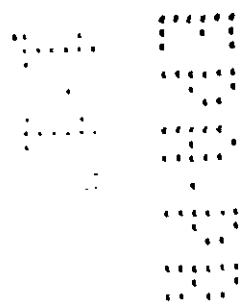

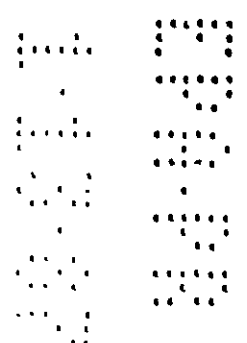

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is toxic to fish and aquatic organisms. Drift and runoff from treated areas may be hazardous to fish and aquatic organisms in adjacent aquatic sites. DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with labeling.

For control of Brown Patch (*Rhizoctonia solani*) of Southern or warm season lawns such as St. Augustine, Bermuda and similar grasses: Make one application in the Fall or Spring at first signs of infection. Mix one quart in sufficient water (10 to 15 gallons) to cover 1,000 square feet. Apply with sprinkler can, hand sprayer, or any other convenient method of obtaining even coverage. Then, lightly water the treated area to insure movement of the chemical through the grass to the soil level. Retrdat the area 3 - 4 weeks later if it has been subjected to unusually heavy rain-fall, or is flooded, or if the disease is severe or re-appears. Under certain growing conditions, a temporary discoloration of the grass may appear occasionally. This causes no harm and disappears shortly.

ORNAMENTALS - Azaleas and Camellias (Azaleas petal blight and Camellia flower blight): Apply as a drench under plants at a rate of 1½ quarts in 30 gallons of water per 150 square feet. Begin application prior to opening of buds and repeat every 3 to 4 weeks through the bloom period.
