

INSECT CONTROL (Cont.)
FOR ORNAMENTALS, FRUIT TREES, FLOWERS, BULBS, VEGETABLES

PLANTS	INSECTS	DOSAGE	COMMENTS
Bulbs, Tulip, Iris, Glads, Lilies	Aphids, Bulb Fly, Iris Borer, Trips	5 tsp/gal water	Treat when insects appear. For Iris Borer soak soil around the tuberous roots May and June Spray foliage as needed for control.
Vegetable Sets, (Cabbage, Melons, Pepper, Onn, Tomatoes)	White Grubs, Cutworms, wire- worms, (Soil only)	5 tsp/gal water (2 gal/250 Sq Ft of soil area)	Do not treat plant foliage. Do not use in soil to be used for root crops. Pour a cup of prepared solution in the planting "hole" before plant is place in soil After planting pour aa cup of solution on the soil surface around the base of each plant
Flowers, Roses, Petunias, Carnations, etc	Aphids, Thrips, White Flies, Leafhoppers	5 tsp/gal water (13/oz./40 gal)	Apply as insects appear. Repeat sprays as needed for control. Thoroughly spray upper and lower sides of leaves and stems

PECAN INSECT CONTROL

For control of Phylloxera (Galls) and the Hickory Shoot Curculio - Mix 2 quarts in 100 gallons of water (5 teaspoonfuls per gallon of water). Apply with a power sprayer or other suitable equipment in the spring as a "Bud Break" spray (early to mid-April when bud break is no more than 2 inches long) making only one application thoroughly wetting all portions of the tree and new bud growth. Plan on using approximately 10 to 15 gallons of diluted spray per bearing tree when planted on 60 foot center (approx. 24 trees per acre.). Do not exceed 450 gallons of dilute spray per acre. Do not graze treated areas. NOTE This control is not effective when typical gall symptoms appear.

IF INHALED: Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if necessary.

- g. Add a street address or P.O. Box Number to the address on the front of the label.

- i. Complete the following sentence under Directions for Use, which reads:

- j. Please update the label Storage and Disposal statement per Pk Notice 83-3 by adding "Do not incinerate or puncture."

3. Please submit a statement of composition of the subject product as required on the data matrix, section 61-2. Provide a complete description of the manufacturing/formulation process describing the equipment used, mixing time, temperature, etc.

4. Submit five (5) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment. Refer to the A-79 enclosure for a further description of final printed labeling.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

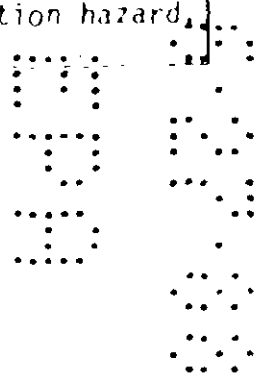

Apply this product only as a coarse spray or crack and crevice treatment to localized areas where pests are found or may occur. Spray surfaces until wet. Repeat as needed.

For Spot Treatment:

To Kill Ants, Cockroaches, Crickets, Silverfish, Spiders, Sowbugs and Carpet Beetles: Spray areas where these pests are found or may hide, including dark corners of rooms and closets; cracks and crevices in walls; along baseboards and door and window frames; behind and beneath sinks, stoves, refrigerators, and cabinets and around garbage cans, plumbing and other utility installations. Pests driven out of hiding places should be sprayed directly. For ants, apply to ant trails, also around doors and windows and wherever else these pests may find entrance. Repeat as necessary.

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
