TICKS: Ticks are usually controlled when WARPAINT is applied per label directions to kill and repel flies. In areas where ticks are a particular problem, WARPAINT should be applied on those areas of the horses body where ticks are attaching, usually under the mane, near the ears and around the tailhead. If treatment in these areas is required, care should be taken not to apply more than 12 grams to the horse in any seven day period. Small amounts of WARPAINT applied to ticks already attached to the horse, will cause the ticks to die and fall from the horse.

LICE: Lice are usually not a problem in hot weather when flies are bothering the horse. Lice most frequently become a problem during cold weather. To treat lice, apply a full tube of WARPAINT, 12 grams, to the back of the horse on the midline just behind the withers. Apply the material in a 12 to 14 inch long ribbon as it comes from the tube. DO NOT SPREAD OUT. If the lice are in the mane and tail, apply some of the material under the mane on the midline where the mane hairs attach to the neck, and around the tailhead. A single dose is usually adequate. Treatment may be repeated, if necessary, at seven day intervals.
