

ESTEEM does exhibit translaminar movement in tomato leaves which means that ESTEEM applied to the upper surfaces of the leaves will move to the lower surface of the leaf. This translaminar movement is very important to chemical control of whitefly since one of the major obstacles is getting the product to the underside of the leaves where whitefly are present.
